Who can be a CIT?

CIT's are boys and girls who are 13 to 15 years old and will be entering 8th, 9th, or 10th grade in the fall. This is a great program for individuals who may feel they are too old to be a camper but not yet old enough or experienced enough to become a counselor. This is an apprenticeship program where participants learn by doing. CIT's have daily leadership training sessions and also work directly with the campers and staff at camp.

Returning CIT program: New at camp this summer is a three week program for individuals who completed a session of CIT training at Camp Echo Bridge in 2009. This program is for individuals who are interested in expanding their skills and involvement in camp.

What does a CIT do?

The CIT Leadership Initiative at Camp Echo Bridge is designed to teach important skills inherent to becoming a camp counselor. The program also helps CIT's understand the importance of inclusive programming and respecting and embracing individual differences.

New CIT's participate in a two week training session, with the option of adding a third week. Each session will include instruction, observation, and activities that will focus on developing the skills necessary to become a great camp counselor. Meetings and training sessions with the CIT Director will take place to help CIT's to further develop their camp counselor skills. CIT's will also work with camper groups throughout the session to further develop their skills.

Returning CIT's will join us for a three week session in which they will continue to gain leadership experience working with campers and staff. They will help plan activities and special events and be role models for campers as well as new CIT's.

Dates:

The Counselor in Training Program will run from July 6 – August 13, 2010. CIT's can sign up for one session per summer. Registration begins on February 2, 2010 and continues until the program fills.

A \$50 non refundable deposit must be submitted with the registration. Final payments are due May 15, 2010. A \$25.00 late fee will be assessed for registrations and payments received after May 15, 2010.

Staff:

The staff consists of the Director of Special Needs, Camp Directors, 3 Teachers from the Newton Public School System, Unit Leaders, and Counselors. We recognize the importance of mature and qualified staff and have selected staff based on their enthusiasm, dedication, and experience. Staff is certified in CPR and First Aid.

The staff and the program meet the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Camping standards and the Newton Health Department licenses the program. Parents may request, in writing, copies of any and all camp policies.

What to bring to camp:

CIT's should wear comfortable appropriate clothing including sneakers and socks. They should bring a bathing suit and towel each day as we swim at Crystal Lake and water play at camp is utilized on very hot days as well. CIT's should also have sunscreen and a water bottle in their backpack. Lunch and snacks should be brought from home and will be kept refrigerated at camp.

CIT T-shirts:

All CIT's will receive two Camp Echo Bridge CIT T-shirts that they should expect to wear each day.

Location and Facilities:

The Counselor in Training Leadership Initiative will be conducted at Camp Echo Bridge at Mason-Rice School. It is located at 149 Pleasant St Newton, MA 02459. The school is centrally located in Newton and is a great place for summer camp. The school offers a variety of playground equipment, fields, and open space.
